What is Academic Triathlon?

Academic Triathlon is a product of the belief that thinking skills should be an important part of education. It is a five-person team challenge for students grades 5 through 8 that rewards strong performance in the areas of general intellect, specific academic abilities, leadership and psycho-social dynamics, visual and performing arts, and creative/productive thinking. Each meet lasts between about four hours, giving skills to last a lifetime.

Why is it called Academic *Triathlon*?

FIVE KINDS OF LEARNING IN *THREE* EVENTS.....Each Meet matches teams of fifth and sixth graders against one another, and seventh and eighth graders against one another. Questions and problems are grade appropriate. Best total team score for the **three** events wins.

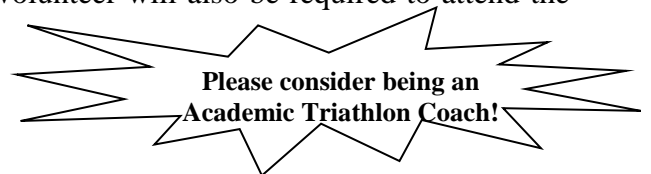
- **FACE-OFF!:** Teams face off to answer questions spanning several academic subject areas, plus current events and consumer issues. The team confers to give its best answer in 15 seconds or less. “Slap tapes” makes this a fast, exciting event.
- **MIND SPRINTS:** Divergent thinking skills, visual problem solving, logic, construction and team cooperation challenges yield fast, creative easy to solve three to five short problems in this round. Sprints may be individual or team challenges, with verbal and nonverbal components, but teammates are urged to encourage one another.
- **P.A.R.T.Y. IN A BOX:** This stands for Preparation, Assemble and Reenactment Theater is Yours—in a Box! Teams receive a problem and equipment with which to solve it. They have a limited time to come up with their best show. Teams perform for one another, receiving points for factors such as “best theme” and “creative use of materials provided.” Students practice good sportsmanship and theater etiquette as they watch how other people solve the same problem in different ways.

How many competitions occur?

Teams compete in three round-robin meets and a regional meet. These four meets are held after school, on Fridays. The first three round-robin meets are *practice* meets. Only teams who earn a first place win at the *regional meet* are qualified to compete at the state meet.

How are the teams made?

A team consists of four or five students. Teams are formed in the order that registrations are received, so please register as soon as possible. Parent coaches act as judge/facilitators, running the meet and helping students to develop and refine higher-level thinking skills. Coaching time outside meets can be minimal. If there is only one coach for a team, a parent volunteer will also be required to attend the meets.

Seven or eight coaches will be hosting each meet (one host for each meet site). These assignments are done through the national office. Coaches are notified in November if/when they will be a meet host for any of the four meets. Coaches who are hosting will have a training the Monday or Tuesday prior to the Meet at the District Service Center from 4:30-5:15 PM.



- **Registration Forms** are available through the homeroom teacher for students in grade 5 and in the middle school front office for students in grades 6 thru 8. They are also available on the Gifted Education website. Go to www.sowashco.org click on **Academics** then **Gifted Education**.
- **Registrations need to be returned by Friday, September 28, 2018. A fee of \$60.00** (checks need to be made out to *South Washington County Schools*) must accompany the registration and be turned into your child's homeroom teacher for elementary students or the front office for middle school students.
- There are a few needs based scholarships available. Please contact Laura Vogel at 651.425.6246 or lvogel2@sowashco.org if you would like more information.
- All parents interested in being a coach for their child's team **must** complete a background check **OR** have volunteered in the last year. Please see the *Coach Registration Form* for further information. The attached *Volunteer Application* goes to the school office coordinator prior to completing a background check. Gifted Education pays the cost of the background check.

What else might you need to know?

- Parents are responsible for transporting their child to and from all of the meets.
- Students may be asked to help by bringing materials for the meets. Some examples are paper, string, paper bags, shiny object, or an empty gallon milk jug.
- Students are expected to maintain good sportsmanship at all of the meets and during practices.
- Parents may be asked to help with a meet if their child's team only has one coach or is hosting a meet.

Please note that some of our volunteering opportunities may require the volunteer to successfully complete a background screen (check). If you will be volunteering for a field trip, as an athletic/academic coach or in any role where you would be alone with students, it is required that you successfully complete a background screen with our district. **The district respectfully asks volunteers to pay the cost (\$10.25) for the background screen.** This background check only expires if there is a gap in volunteering for one year or longer. *Gifted Education pays the cost. You need a special link*

Criminal Background Screening Standards

The South Washington County School District strives to maintain a safe and healthy educational environment that promotes the physical, social and psychological well-being of all students. All new employees and designated volunteers must receive a criminal background check prior to starting employment or a volunteer assignment with South Washington County Schools. An individual will be disqualified and prohibited from serving as an employee or volunteer if that individual has been found guilty or entered a plea of non-contender (no contest), regardless of the adjudication for any of the following disqualifying offenses:

- 1. Sex Offenses**
 - A. All Sex Offenses- Regardless of the amount of time since the offense
 - i. Examples: Child molestation, rape, sexual assault, sexual battery, sodomy, prostitution, solicitation, indecent exposure, etc.

- 2. Felonies**
 - A. All Violent Felony Offenses- Regardless of the amount of time since the offense
 - i. Examples: Murder, manslaughter, aggravated assault, kidnapping, robbery, aggravated burglary, etc.
 - B. All Felony Offenses, other than violent or sex within the past ten (10) years.
 - i. Examples: Drug offenses, theft, embezzlement, fraud, child endangerment, etc.

- 3. Misdemeanors**
 - A. All Violent Misdemeanor offenses within the past five (5) years, or multiple offenses within the past seven (7) years.
 - i. Examples: Simple drug possession, drunk and disorderly conduct, public intoxication, possession of drug paraphernalia, etc.
 - B. Any other Misdemeanor offense within the past five (5) years that would be considered a potential danger to children, or is directly related to the functions of that employee or volunteer.
 - i. Examples: Contributing to the delinquency of a minor, providing alcohol to a minor, theft (if person is handling monies), etc.

The district reserves the discretion to consider factors and information, including whether the nature of the offense implicates a behavior that is contradictory to an individual's job description, when making employment decisions.
