YSB on Campus

Youth Service Bureau (YSB) is again partnering with SWAHS this upcoming school year to provide services to our students in the areas of mental health therapy and chemical health counseling at no cost to our students and families. Lunch at SWAHS

During orientation week SWAHS students went through several key aspects of the student handbook. One aspect that was covered was an adjustment regarding lunch. After reviewing the past four years of data, where we looked at attendance and behavioral data, much of the trends were connected to our lunch procedures.

This school year as we looked at our schedule, reviewed food service guidance and the increase in delivery services around the area we made the decision to have students stay on campus for lunch.

If a student chooses to order delivery, we ask that they order so that their items arrive between 12:40 and 12:55. If items arrive early we will do our best to keep their hot items hot and cold items cold.

If a student would like to bring food in, we have a microwave, refrigerator, and sink that students can access to heat up food, store food, or access water. Similar to last school year South Washington County Schools is offering free breakfast and lunch for all students. Students should have their lunch order in prior to 9:30 in the main office.

School Check Out Process

If it is necessary for a student to check out of school before the end of the day, the student must sign out in the office. A parent/guardian must call or email the main office to check their student out. Students will NOT be allowed to check back into school, unless they are returning with verification of the absence. If a student checks out of school before or during a class, it will count as an absence.

Student Ambassadors

Over the next few weeks several students will be asked to be part of a student ambassador group at SWAHS. This group is a leadership group we put together yearly with input from previous student ambassadors and staff members. In past years student ambassadors provide feedback on school activities, speak on their experiences at SWAHS, and help plan for academic and social school events. Student ambassador meetings will occur bi-weekly during 5th period.
